Rector Reflection

A wonderful thing happened last Sunday. A small group of us got wrapped up in conversation. Everyone left, even the coffee hour hosts! We were talking about Sr. Amy's life profession of vows in the Anglican Order of Preachers. I was then asked what my new role as "Master of the Order" entails. Such a great question. The short answer is that I am primarily responsible for seeing to the Formation of those discerning if they have a vocation from God with the Anglican Dominicans. This is a three-year program of rigorous study and prayer and conversation. I will be teaching in the fall (starting Sept 17) a group of Novice Brothers and Sisters who are in their third year of Formation. What will I be teaching? Preaching of course. And with all the mechanics that go into writing a sermon I am particular in pressing would be Dominicans to think hard about the 'why' of preaching.

Why do we do it as a practice within worship? Again... a very short answer is that the Word of God must be proclaimed! We have God's great and good news of repentance and forgiveness and eternal life to share. Christian worship has ALWAYS included hearing from Scripture. First just the Old Testament and as the Apostles and early church leaders wrote their witness to Christ, their writings were shared and gathered together. Some of those writings were chosen that the leadership felt best represented the consistent witness/story of Jesus as the Messiah. These became the New Testament. It is for Christian believers the Word of God. What does this mean? It means that God 'breathed' it. Literally, IN-SPIRED, breathed into the hearts and minds of many throughout the arch of the history of Hebrew people to the time of the Apostles and the emerging Church that followed Jesus.

We preach because there are exceptional stories to be told. We preach because there are important questions to consider about the meaning of life, the existence of God, the existence of evil, what happens when we die and many moral questions for how to live with one another as a human family. The Word of God is complex, and it has the power to speak into our very depths about all that is good and right in us and in the world God has made.

We preach because the God revealed throughout the arc of the whole Bible story is supremely good, just, holy and loves us and wants our best and highest good. How could we keep silent? We preach during worship because we come expecting God to speak and to touch us in our deepest point of need whether that be comfort or growth. So, what am I doing as the Master of the Order? The things I love most. Teaching and preaching about the wondrous works of God who is life itself!



Junior Warden's Report

At our June meeting the vestry determined that parish security could be improved if we limited entry to the sanctuary to the single entrance at the back of the narthex. To accomplish this, we have had a security door constructed in the hall by the sacristy, and we have installed keypad locks on the doors that lead to the front of the church. Dave Laird arranged to get the new locks keyed to the same key, and the locks have been set to one PIN code.

You have probably noticed that there is a stained-glass window panel missing in the back of the church by the AV station, the result of a rock that came through that panel. Although local stained-glass workers were not willing to take on the repair, we have located a skilled artisan in Eugene who will be able to bring the panel back to its original condition. The panel was delivered to his workshop on Monday, and he expects to have the repair completed by early September.

At the Devereux Center, we believe in helping people to *Dream Again*. Our day center helps the mentally ill and homeless to meet their basic needs, so they can find the hope and dignity to break the cycle of homelessness and depression.

DID YOU KNOW...

- Our warming center had over 3825 guests during the 2022-2023 season. This represents a +90% increase in the number served over the previous season.
- Our warming center was open 80 nights, almost double the number of last season.
- That means, on average, 48 guests spent the night in our warming center.
