As you know, hymns are one of the main sources of theology for Christians beyond the Holy Scriptures. Lyrics are often taken from a Scripture passage and then expanded with meaning applied in verse and meter. Enjoy the words of this classic Easter Hymn by Samuel Medley written in 1775. They remind us of ALL the ways the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead matters.

Back to Pre-Covid Communion Practices

The Bishop notified the clergy at our monthly meeting this week that all parishes are asked to revert back to receiving the elements of Holy Eucharist in both kinds and by using the common cup. Therefore, we will not practice intinction but receive by sipping from the Chalice. If you are not comfortable with receiving the consecrated wine in this manner please know that

receiving the Eucharist only by eating the host is completely acceptable and understood to be fully receiving Eucharist. We will continue to have two stations at the bottom of the stairs as this enables the maximum amount of safe accessibility for all.

Holy Week with Jesus



"Pandemic food assistance that held back hunger comes to an end. Millions of Americans will have less to spend on groceries as emergency food assistance that Congress enacted early in the pandemic has ended (effective March 2023).

On average, individuals will get about \$90 less this month in benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, known as SNAP. Families will see a cut of \$250 a month or more."
