Rector Reflection

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." Ecclesiastes 3:1

On May 20th, Emmanuel will be holding a yard sale. Not just any yard sale mind you, but a very special one. As you know, the Coastal Families Relief Nursery is now occupying the Preschool "wing" of our building. They have transformed the space into a lovely new space for students who will begin on our campus very soon. It has been exciting to see the brand-new relief nursery emerge! The Yard Sale will be of the Emmanuel Episcopal Preschool items that are too old, too worn, or not certified for use in the new Preschool. Frankly, we have A LOT of stuff. It has been thoroughly poured over and reviewed by the Relief Nursery Board of whom our own Nancylee Stewart is a member. Working with Evan Porter, the Executive Director of the new Relief Nursery, we are hoping to sell all (or mostly all) of our former preschool goods to others in our community who work with young children. All the proceeds from the sale of these items will go to the 'new roof fund'. If you know anyone who does in-home childcare or works in a preschool setting or daycare, please let them know of the Yard Sale. Also.... it will take many hands to carry down from the second floor the many items we have marked for sale. We will relocate them to the Undercroft on the afternoon of May 18 & 19 so they will be available to set out in the driveway/breezeway on Saturday, May 20th, the day of the Sale. (Pray for excellent weather!!)

Please let Kerri know if you are available to volunteer to help with this momentous project!

As to the text which I began with.... It is a truth, a statement of the reality of human life. We are born, we live and we die. There truly is a season for all things. This sale really marks, with a kind of finality, the end of the Emmanuel Preschool Era. This is a moment to be reflective of how many lives were touched. It is also a moment for us to have a healthy goodbye and acknowledge that Emmanuel Preschool is gone. However, in giving the proceeds of the sale to the roof fund we are stepping out

into the continuance of Emmanuel Parish as a whole. By hosting the new Relief Nursery, we still serve families and are sowing seeds of health and stability into families throughout our community. It is sad to let the 'things' go. But it is a joy to see what new thing God is doing! Indeed, to everything there is a season.

On Tuesday, May 16, at 8:30am Emmanuel will host an informal breakfast gathering with Ms. Pamela Filbert who is a volunteer historian researching the experience of communities of color in Coos County. Last year, Ms. Filbert gave a lecture at the Coos History Museum on African Americans who worked at the coal mine on Beaver Hill. It was a very interesting piece of local history.

Currently she is working on the details of an unsolved murder of an African American man who died off the Coos Bay docks in 1924. It is another sobering glimpse into the history of race relations in Coos Bay and an important history to tell.
