Rector's Reflections

We all know that Thanksgiving, as a holiday, is kind of a misnomer for those who call Jesus the Lord. Thanksgiving is a way of life for people of faith. We say grace before meals. We give thanks at the beginning and the end of the day. There is NO day that is NOT Thanksgiving! The Psalmist writes:

"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.

O give thanks to the Lord, call on his name, make known his deeds among the peoples."

Thanksgiving is integral to the life of faith. In the act of giving Thanks there is a profound spiritual power that can lift you up out of a place of darkness and despair. Thanksgiving prayers to God lifts our hearts and opens our eyes to see the Lord at work in us, and through us and for us. This is why in the "Great Thanksgiving" (which is what the word 'Eucharist' means) we begin:

"The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise...."

Then we recount the mighty deeds of God's salvation in Jesus Christ and we receive God's true presence in the elements of Eucharist. Please do have a wonderful (and safe) celebration of Thanksgiving with your loved ones and remember that God is good all the time, not

just that one Thursday in November!


November Music Highlights

Vestry, September 1951

The following is an excerpt from our parish records of vestry minutes for the year 1951. This was the last meeting recorded for the year until the Annual Meeting held Sunday evening on January 20, 1952.

"A meeting of the vestry was held on September 4, 1951 at 8 pm at the rectory. Those present were Tresidder, Popplewell, Schuttpelz, Kohler, Anderson, Forrester, and Father Greene.

Father Greene informed us that the Standard Insurance Co. will accept our request for a loan for 23,813 at 5% for 10 years, to be paid monthly at the rate of 238.13 per month. Anderson moved and Schuttpelz seconded the motion that we make application for the loan on this basis. Voted and carried and so ordered.

Father Greene made Earl Popplewell in charge of ushers for the coming year.

Anderson moves and Kohler seconded the motion that Charles Tresidder be appointed Treasurer to succeed Howard Garrison. Voted, carried and so ordered.

Father Greene announced the budget committee members as Al Kohler, Howard Garrison, and Charles Tresidder. He also appointed Doug White as head of the canvas committee.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned. Signed *John Forrester*, Clerk of Vestry"
