Join us in welcoming our new custodian, Sierra Folks





Onion Shortcake Recipe (as requested by popular demand) 😊

Serves 4 – 6 Bake 425 degrees, 25-30 minutes

- 1 large, sweet onion
- ¼ cup butter
- 1 ½ cups corn muffin mix (I use Jiffy brand.)
- 1 egg
- 1/3 cup milk
- 1 cup cream style corn
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sour cream
- ¼ teaspoon dill weed
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheese



Peel and slice onion and cook in butter until tender. Combine onions with sour cream, salt, dill, and half of the cheese. Set batter aside.

Blend together the corn muffin mix, egg, milk, and corn. Turn into well-greased 8 x 8 baking dish.

Spread onion mixture over batter and top with remaining cheese. Bake at 425 degrees for 25 – 30 minutes.
